Isaiah 61:1-6 Leviticus 25:8-13

Discussion Questions for Personal Life and Community Gathering

1. **Reputation is determined by mission.** Read Luke 4:14-30. What is the power behind Christ’s mission? What other scriptures in Luke 1-4 point to this power source?

If a report circulated around the city based on your reputation, what would it say?

2. **Brokenness is met with the beauty of Christ.** Read both Luke 4:16-19 and Isaiah 61:1-6. What are the four areas of brokenness found in these verses? How is the gospel good news to each area of brokenness?

Take time to share stories on how God personally delivered you from a particular area of brokenness?

3. **Jesus is not to be admired, He is to be worshipped.** Read Luke 4:20-22. In verse 22, how does the statement, “Is not this Joseph’s son” call into question Christ’s claim to be the Messiah?

What are some ways you admire Christ but fail in your purpose of worshipping Him?

4. **The Gospel has no bounds.** Read Luke 4:23-27. Why does Jesus use these two prophets as examples of an “available for all” gospel?

How often do you hang out with others outside your normal circles? What could you do to change this?

5. **The Gospel evokes an emotional response.** Read Luke 4:28-30. Why did the Jews turn to wrath so quickly? Look deeper at Isaiah 61:1-2 and find the phrase Jesus leaves out in His reading of the scripture? Why would this cause wrath among the Jews?

What type of emotional response has the Gospel evoked in you?
